LIBRARY NEWS

Washington County Free Library is excited to announce a new feature designed to make your library experience even more convenient:

automatic renewals!

STARTING APRIL 2, 2025:

 All patrons are automatically enrolled in automatic renewals.

 Most eligible items will automatically renew up to 3 times.

 Interlibrary loan items borrowed through Maryland libraries will only automatically renew 2 times.

 Online Computer Library Center (OCLC) Interlibrary Loan items are not eligible for manual or automatic renewal.

The new due date will be calculated from the original due date, so you will not lose any borrowing time.

You will receive a courtesy notice stating which items on your account did or did not renew, and the corresponding due dates.

Enjoy your materials for longer without worrying about manually renewing them.
